

The Unique Villages of Santorini

MEGALOHORI

Megalohori exudes an elegant, well-preserved character, as the heart of Santorini's winemaking, steeped in medieval merchant and pirate lore. Labyrinthine alleys, majestic bell towers, and vine-covered landscapes honor its rich history.

FIRA

The capital of the island, Fira, offers mesmerizing views of the volcano from its clifftop location, and an array of shops with local and designers' items, restaurants, cafes, as well as the Museum of Prehistoric Thira and the Orthodox Metropolitan Cathedral of Santorini.

OIA

Promenade through Oía, the cosmopolitan heart of Santorini, lying in the northern part of the caldera. Marvel at cave-style houses, blue-domed churches on cliffs, and panoramic Aegean Sea vistas. Explore streets with Greek shops, boutiques, restaurant and cafes.

PYRGOS

Explore the fortified medieval settlement of Pyrgos. Traditional neoclassical captains' mansions, small white houses and blue-domed churches connected by narrow winding paths lead up the hillside. To top the experience, drive at the top of the mountain of Prophet Elias for a breathtaking panoramic view of the entire island.

EMPORIO

A peaceful settlement with charming medieval alleys, dotted by whitewashed cave-style houses and blue-domed Orthodox churches with elaborate bell towers, Emporio is the largest village of Santorini. The medieval castle or Kasteli, is one of the five fortified castles of Santorini, built centuries ago to provide refuge from pirate raids.

PERIVOLOS BLACK SAND BEACH

Just imagine dipping your feet into the warm, gorgeous black volcanic pebbly sand before immersing into the spectacular deep blue waters. Visit our beach club at Istoria Hotel, stretch out on the sun loungers and enjoy an exotic cocktail prepared by our attentive service team on the beach. Try out various water sports, play beach volleyball and take a romantic stroll along the long shore toward the rugged mountain of Mesa Vouno which rises to the north.

YACHT AND SPEEDBOAT CRUISE

Ride the waves of the Aegean Sea onboard a private speedboat and cruise through the Caldera and nearby islands. Feel the wind in your hair and the sun on your skin as you glide effortlessly along the coastline, past rugged cliffs and hidden coves waiting to be explored. Dive into crystalline waters for a refreshing swim, soak up the Mediterranean sun on secluded beaches, or explore quaint seaside towns brimming with culture and charm.





SAILING CRUISE

Time to hoist the sails! It's one thing to view the geomorphological wonder that is the caldera of Santorini and its cliffs from land and another to see it from sea level. Cruise the caldera of Santorini aboard a catamaran or sailing yacht. A wide range of tours is available with routes that feature swim and snorkel stops, including the volcanic island of Palia Kammeni and its therapeutic sulfur springs. Capture photos of the Red beach and the White beach, Akrotiri Lighthouse and a cliff that the locals call the face of the Indian. Tours include a barbecue meal and drinks onboard.

HELICOPTER TOUR

Picture yourself perched at the edge of your seat, gazing out over the magnificent caldera and witnessing the unparalleled sunset of Santorini. A helicopter tour promises an unparalleled sightseeing adventure, whisking you away from the bustling crowds to indulge in the awe-inspiring volcanic beauty of this remarkable island.

HORSEBACK RIDING

Ride a horse on the beautiful Eros beach, under the shadow of a steep rock, carved by the artistic power of the sea, the sand and the wind resulting in an almost lunar scenery. Starting at the stables in Megalohori, ride along paths surrounded by vineyards and continue along the beach towards the top of the hill to enjoy the panoramic view of the beach and the trails.

HIKING

While the views from Fira and Oía are sure to impress most, even more spectacular panoramas await those who trek to small villages at higher heights such as Imerovigli, Skaros and Pyrgos. From cliff-top walks to volcanic vistas, the island of Santorini boasts some of Mediterranean's best hikes. Explore untouched landscapes and picturesque villages and admire the stunning views of the deep blue waters of the Aegean Sea.

WATER SPORTS

Water sports are available at the beach of Perivolos and range from water-ski and paragliding to jet-ski and more. Snorkeling in the crystal-clear waters surrounding Santorini and its active volcano is a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

YOGA SESSIONS

Immerse yourself in a rejuvenating practice of yoga to nourish yourself from the inside out and reconnect to the source of wellbeing. A transformative yoga session gives you a full physical and emotional overhaul within the alluring energy of the volcanic island of Santorini.

Special Sights of Santorini

AKROTIRI ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE, AKROTIRI

Visit the ancient Minoan town of Akrotiri, an inspiring site overshadowed by an impressive medieval fortress, one of the most important prehistoric settlements of Greece. The most ancient one at the site dates from the Late Neolithic times. Visiting Akrotiri is a journey through time, where you can walk in the footsteps of the Minoans, a civilization that left an indelible mark on history.

MUSEUM OF PREHISTORIC THIRA, FIRA

In Fira, the Museum of Prehistoric Thira occupies the former Ypapanti Church site, lost in the 1956 earthquake that shook Santorini. It showcases a wide range of artifacts from various Santorini digs, including Akrotiri and the nearby Potamos site. Here, the rich tapestry of Santorini's history comes to life, inviting visitors to partake in the ongoing narrative of this remarkable island.

FOLKLORE MUSEUM EMMANUEL LIGNOS, FIRA

Nestled within a meticulously preserved 1861 traditional cave house, the Folklore Museum Emmanuel Lignos stands as a living testament to the allure of 19th-century Santorini. This remarkable museum offers visitors a captivating journey through the island's history and the indomitable spirit of its people.

ANCIENT THIRA, KAMARI

The ruins of the city of Ancient Thira will take you back thousands of years, before the big eruption of the volcano took place. Beneath the azure skies and overlooking the sparkling Aegean Sea, you will walk in the footsteps of those who called Ancient Thira their home. These well-preserved ruins beckon you to immerse yourself in a time when life unfolded against a backdrop of breathtaking natural beauty and cultural richness.





Special Sights of Santorini

SYMPOSION CULTURAL CENTER, MEGALOHORI

In ancient Greece, the symposium followed banquets, featuring music and dance. Today, Symposion Cultural Center revives this tradition with workshops, vintage instruments, and captivating performances, engaging all the senses in a living tribute to Greek culture.

PROPHET ELIAS MONASTERY, PYRGOS

Prophet Elias Monastery sits proudly in the southeastern part of Santorini, on top of Mount Profitis Ilias, the island's highest peak at 567 meters above sea level. This special place is one of the few spots on Santorini that was there before the volcanic eruption, and managed to survive. From this point, visitors are treated to awe-inspiring panoramic vistas from the northern all the way to the southern part of the island.

TOMATO INDUSTRIAL MUSEUM, VLYCHADA

In 2014, the D. Nomikos tomato factory in Vlychada transformed into the Tomato Industrial Museum. This space preserves the tomato processing history of Santorini, while also serving as a dynamic hub for arts and culture. Today, it is a testament to merging history and creativity, cultivating a lively community of artists and culture enthusiasts.

AKROTIRI LIGHTHOUSE, AKROTIRI

Constructed in 1892, the Akrotiri Lighthouse occupies a significant role in Greek maritime heritage, ranking among the earliest lighthouses within the nation. Beyond its historical importance, this lighthouse offers an idyllic setting to relish a breathtaking sunset. Yet, amidst its picturesque charm and historical significance, the Akrotiri Lighthouse stands tall, releasing a brilliant white light every 10 seconds, unwavering in its commitment to protecting the safety of vessels.

EXPLORE TRADITIONAL WINERIES

Santorini has a strong tradition of wine production, dating to ancient times, with a variety of 20 different wineries to visit and taste an array of crisp indigenous wines. From the volcanic soils of Pyrgos and Megalochori to the cliffside estates of Oia, each tasting unveils a new facet of Santorini's winemaking heritage, steeped in tradition yet brimming with innovation. Book a wine tour through several wineries and embark on a sensory journey through the sundrenched vineyards of Santorini.

Within our sister property, Vedema, a Luxury Coolection Resort in Megalohori, the Canava Wine Bar is part of a 400-year-old winery complex and provides a fascinating atmospheric backdrop for exploring the world of wine.

HATZIDAKIS WINERY

Established in 1997, Hatzidakis Winery excels in crafting wines within a cave's stable temperatures, eliminating the need for human intervention. Explore Santorini's grapes, unique microclimate, and Hatzidakis family's meticulous organic practices.

ESTATE ARGYROS

Estate Argyros has been established in 1903, but the Argyros family has been involved in wine production for decades before that. It is the largest private owner of vineyards in Santorini and its current landholdings exceed 120 hectares, a vast, four-generations-long investment.

OENO P WINERY

Nestled within Paris Sigalas' family wine cave, boasting three decades of expertise, a top-tier winery has emerged. With a modern tasting room and seaside courtyard, the staff, including the winemaker, offer captivating winemaking secrets.
